Two figures, obscurely intertwined, rest against the flatness of a white background. Cartoonish, romantic, subtle and daring, *Posters International: A Puppet Perspective* unites diverse images from around the globe. Each of these placards, which advertise productions and festivals from UNIMA (Union Internationale de la Marionette) Centers, reflects the unique culture of the countries they represent -- from the Czech Republic to Italy to Argentina.
