TIED BY HATE, BOUND BY LOVE: DANISH MYTHOLOGICAL EPIC SCREENS AT THE CENTER FOR PUPPETRY ARTS

WHAT: *Strings Film Viewing.* Presented in cooperation with the Danish American Chamber of Commerce, *Strings* is the world's first fully integrated marionette feature film. The award-winning movie is a mythological epic about the son of a king, Hal Tara, who takes over the throne when his father, The Kharo, is found dead. When Hal Tara discovers that his father's apparent suicide was instead a murder, he sets out on a journey to avenge his father's death. Called "ground breaking fantasy animation" by the London Film Festival, *Strings* is a stunning film combining puppetry and animation.
